FUNCTION:

The candidate will be required to teach undergraduate and graduate level courses, to mentor students and to conduct activities related to other aspects of a professor's duties: research, academic management and service to the community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Doctoral degree in a discipline of management sciences or human and social sciences, with a specialty in research with Indigenous people or specialty relevant to these communities. Candidates who are prepared and about to defend their doctoral dissertation will be considered for the position.
- Record of scientific publications and communications on Indigenous studies.
- Proficiency in spoken and written French and English; the application of a candidate who is not proficient in French may be considered, subject to specific conditions.

OTHER CRITERIA CONSIDERED AS AN ASSET:

- Experience in university teaching.
- Experience in supervising graduate students.
- Knowledge of an Indigenous language.
